To begin, I am vaguely aware that there is a TV show entitled "The Crown", but I have never seen it and have only a basic idea what it is about! For the purposes of this article, I am more interested in the biblical theme of *the crown*, that I have been struck by as I have prepared for our Friday morning Bible study over the past few weeks.

Here's a brief sketch of the biblical journey of the crown.

The crowned King creates the universe and everything that fills it. The pinnacle of this creation is humankind whom He crowns with glory. They waste this authority by relinquishing their crown to a serpent's deception, who becomes the tyrannical ruler of a now fallen creation (Ephesians 2:1-3). But hidden in the curse is a promise - that the true King will return and re-crown humanity. He does it in the most incredible way - dying wearing a crown of thorns, with "King of the Jews" written above His head. After He is resurrected and has ascended, he sends the seal of royalty, the Holy Spirit to testify from within us that we are crowned princes and princesses. Later "the disciple (King) Jesus loved" had a vision of the Heavenly Kingdom in which there was a throne, and around it were twenty-four elders wearing their crowns. And he saw that when worship began, they voluntarily bowed low and cast down those crowns in reverence to the King on the throne. And then the whole Bible ends with the King and His re-crowned people reunited and coreigning forever.

Here are a few questions...

Have you been re-crowned by the victorious King?

Have you definitively vacated the throne of your life and invited the rightful King to sit down?

If so, are the beautiful attitudes of the Kingdom (Beatitudes) visible in your life? Are you a worshipper who bows low, casts down your crown, and loves to elevate the King? Corporately, as the King patrols our church (as in Revelation 2-3) does He rejoice at our faithful witness?

I close with a prayer, please use it now:

#### Lord Jesus,

I want to crown You as Lord of my life, You are the Lamb who reigns from Your throne. I want my life to be filled with a heavenly anthem that drowns out all other noise with praise. Lord cause my soul to awake and sing of Your glorious dying and rising! I hail You as my matchless King for all eternity, Amen



# NETWORK INTERVIEWS – JOBS FOR ALL...IN HIS TIME

KNOWING what to do with your life in Christ Jesus is both simple and well... not so simple.

How can that be?

Well, the Great Commission is clear and simple. In Matthew 28:19 the disciples (then as now) are told to go into all the world and make disciples of all nations... We are to make disciples.

Fine, but how and with what? Christ's Gospel answers the 'how', it's power and the love redolent within its words transforms lives in the strength of the Holy Spirit and by the grace of God.

And the 'with what' part of the question is answered by using the spiritual gifts God has given each and every one of you. Those attending the Network Course in the latter part of last year discovered their gifts and their passion for the work they are made to do in the Lord and for the Lord.

Recently, many of those who attended came along to an evening where those gifts were discussed on a one-to-one basis with a member of the church's leadership team with a view to placing that person in an appropriate ministry.

Indeed there are many ministries of God but the same 'Great Commission' and finding one's place in that objective is the desire of Christians the world over. Or it should be!

In Magheralin and Dollingstown we have been playing our part by running the Network Course and then following up with attendees with the objective that in the near future we will place them in ministries within the church that meet their unique gifts.

It's a process of prayerful dialogue and for some, 'interview night' raised more questions than answers! But that's OK. Building the Kingdom of God here on earth was never intended to be an easy process. It's about faith, love, perseverance, commitment, patience and being attuned to the will of the Spirit in our lives.

The point is, more than 50 people at the beginning of the Network Course raised their heads above the parapet and declared their intention to engage in kingdom building.

To paraphrase that well known catchphrase from the quiz show, Mastermind, 'we've started but God's not finished!'

Keep praying.

## PROMISES, PROMISES...

Life's full of disappointments – some big, some small - some trivial and indeed some quite serious.

It's the nature of a fallen world that no matter how hard one tries to avoid the lows in life and capture the highs – it's inevitable that all of us face trouble at some point.

It's personal, deeply relevant to the bearer and not to be compared with others and their problems.

And in those times it's important to remember that turning to Christ and relying on His promises is an imperative for the Christian and not an optional extra, like the size of alloys one chooses for a new car. Yet those of us who claim Christ crucified are as forgetful as any body of people when trouble strikes or things don't go as planned.

It's always been the same. From the moment the Israelites had their backs to the Red Sea they were bemoaning their God who had brought them to this point. It would have been much handier they thought to have stayed a slave in Egypt – three square meals a day, a roof over their heads and if you played ball then the beatings weren't that bad. Being a slave was preferable to freedom in God especially when drowning looked the most likely outcome to their present predicament.

Well, we know what happened. God was good to His promise to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and, as we know, He did so in a spectacular way.

Not so long after this deliverance the Israelites bent over backwards, so to speak, confessing their obedience to God but when Moses disappeared up the mountain to speak to God and get the Ten Commandments, he was only gone a few days when many (but not all) of the same people persuaded feeble Aaron to turn their earrings into a Golden Calf so they would have a god to worship. Moses after all hadn't come back. What a rubbish leader – taking time to listen to God! Whatever next?

In just days they'd forgotten their promise of obedience, failed to recognise how Moses pleaded for mercy with God on their behalf and how a loving God kept His promises to His people.

There's no doubt that there must be times when we exasperate God with our fickle faith and there is no doubt that in times of trouble we get exasperated with God, whom we want to treat as the genie in the lamp instantly granting our three wishes.

Yet the promises of God haven't changed and indeed God hasn't changed. He still loves us despite ourselves. There are many promises God has made to us — look them up and see how may you find.

A favourite is this from **Hebrews 13:5:** Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, "I will **never leave** you **nor forsake** you."

Enough said!



## DOWN AND DROMORE ST PATRICK'S DAY CELEBRATIONS 2019

The diocese is partnering with Open Doors UK & Ireland for the annual St Patrick's Day Festival on Monday 18 March.

The theme is Counting the Cost – Standing with the Persecuted Church and we will have a unique opportunity to hear from an Egyptian Christian 'Michael Jones' and the President of Open Doors, Eddie Lyle.

"Michael" is a Cairo-based businessman and evangelical Christian who has addressed the UK Parliament. He will speak at the Festival Service in Down Cathedral (11.45 am) and Eddie will speak at the service of Holy Communion at Saul (9.15 am). The Prayer Pilgrimage from Saul to Downpatrick will also focus on the persecuted church and will be led by Chris Philips from Open Doors.

Christians in Egypt make up 10% of the population but around 50% of all the Christians in the Middle East. They face daily discrimination and intimidation. Christians are overlooked for jobs or promotion, university students are given bad grades or failed, schoolchildren are made to sit at the back of the class, shop owners are boycotted and hospital patients are not given proper treatment. Yet they refuse to give up their faith.

Please join us on Monday 18 March in standing with them and the persecuted church worldwide.



# The Road to Calvary Magheralin Parish Church Palm Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> April 2019 at 6.30pm

At the time of writing the Choir has just begun preparations for a unique service on the evening of Palm Sunday (14<sup>th</sup> April). Titled *The Road to Calvary,* this service will explore through readings and music the significance of the events between Christ's entry into Jerusalem and Good Friday.

## PSALM 63 OR HOW TO COPE WITH THE PRESSURES OF DAILY LIFE

If you had to describe our society in a single word, the most appropriate one would be pressure. We live with pressure in every aspect of life, from our school, work or family life, to the big issues facing our world.


King David knew what it meant to live under pressure. His son, Absalom, led a rebellion against him, resulting in David fleeing for his life into the wilderness of Judah. It was there that he wrote Psalm 63. The psalm demonstrates the priorities a person of God under pressure.

**God my desire:** 'You, God, are my God, earnestly I seek you; I thirst for you, my whole being longs for you, in a dry and parched land where there is no water.' (v1). David's physical thirst was an expression of his deeper thirst to know God. Even though separated from the worship of the sanctuary, he chose to seek God. When God seems distant or silence in our lives, we too can choose to seek him; this can be a vital path of growth in our relationship with him.

**God my delight:** 'Because your love is better than life, my lips will glorify you.'(3). David 's delight in God is expressed in praise, as he recognises God's love for him. What gives us delight in our lives? Does it come from the things of this world or from God himself?

**God my defence:** 'I cling to you; your right hand upholds me.' (8). David is surrounded by enemies, but confident in God's defence and purpose for him. God uses our troubles and disappointments to fulfil his will, as he develops our character and trust in his purposes.

'Don't worry about locating your purpose. If you are seeking after God, your purpose will locate you.'


