



Greetings everyone! I hope you have had a fantastic summer and are feeling renewed and refreshed for a new season....

A few months ago, I noticed a story in the media about an 8 year old finding a pre-Viking-era sword while swimming in a lake in Sweden. Experts believe it may have dated to around 1,500 years ago! The level of the water was extremely low at the time, owing to a drought, which is probably why the young girl uncovered the ancient weapon.

*An ancient weapon discovered in a time of drought....* In her history the church has often needed to return to and rediscover a weapon that blesses us and the Lord, terrifies the enemy and changes nations.

I want to call our church back to prayer at this time.

The late Peter Deyneka, the founder of the Slavic Gospel Association used to say, "Much prayer, much power! No prayer, no power!"  
Is this weapon in your hand or at the bottom of the lake?

"If I announce a banquet," a pastor once said, "people will come out of the woodwork to attend. But if I announce a prayer meeting, I'm lucky if the wardens show up!"

Over the next months, there will be opportunities for gatherings for prayer. Our evening worship will seek to release us into being a "house of prayer for all nations" through the prayer course. 
May our lives and our church be aflame with unceasing prayer and praise.

# THE SPIRITUAL CHALLENGE OF EUROPE

Perhaps some of us had the opportunity to visit different parts of Europe over the last few months to enjoy a holiday.

We had the opportunity to visit the Algarve in southern Portugal at the end of May for the first time. The majority of the population are naturally affiliated with the Roman Catholic Church whether nominal or practicing. However the growing trend in many parts of Europe today is secularism with no affiliation to any institutional religion. There are some disturbing statistics with regards to Portugal in particular.

In Lisbon the capital there are twice as many atheists as Christian believers. Evangelicals in particular only make up 2.8 percent of the population, almost two-thirds of these are foreigners (largely Brazilian and African immigrants).

Whatever the future holds with regards our relationship with Europe in the months and years ahead, we need to pray for the "spiritual soul" of Europe.

There was a time when Europe was considered the Christian continent, yet through the 19th and 20th centuries, Europeans increasingly looked to science and progress economics and secular politics for the answer to their problems. In effect they put their faith and hope in "another Gospel".

In 2017 we celebrated the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. In 1960 West Germany was ninety seven percent Christian, today it is only 63 percent. Church attendance is down across the board, falling to 11 percent for Catholic and 4 percent for Lutherans. Much of the German population is effectively unreached. Let us pray in particular that God would revive His Church in those lands that were once the heart lands of Protestantism; Germany, Sweden, Denmark, France, the Czech Republic and the United Kingdom.

There are various Christian agencies working along side the Churches in Europe such as the European Christian Mission.

We in the Anglican Church have our own particular ministry in Europe through the Intercontinental Church Society.

The ICS is an international Evangelical Anglican Mission Society which makes known the Christ of the scriptures to people of any nationality who speak English through church planting, church growth and outreach to tourists.

The representative for ICS in Northern Ireland is John Dinnen (former Rector of Hillsborough parish church and Dean of Down).

May God help us to be faithful in our prayers for the witness of his church throughout Europe in these days.

## FIELDS OF LIFE

Last year saw the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of this organisation which had its beginnings in Magheralin. As many of you know the Curate Trevor Stevenson had a vision to help the people of Uganda in the 1990's which was going through a difficult period following the reign of Idi Amin. Trevor raised sufficient money to purchase some land in Uganda by travelling around the whole of Ireland, North and South, on a tractor. There are still several parishioners who remember these beginnings. Today 124 schools have been built and over 700 wells have been drilled to bring clean water to many communities. A book has been written about the history of Fields of Life and will be launched at several venues over the coming months. It is hoped that Magheralin will be one of the venues. A special conference for Fields of Life will be held at Dromantine Conference Centre near Newry on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September 9.00am – 6.00pm. Many of our members are certainly 'getting on' in years and we pass on our very best wishes to Ruth who celebrated a significant birthday a few weeks ago!





- By enabling together we flourish: ensuring that the work we do continually meets the needs of people known to us – as we always say – “around the world and around the corner”





## **MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR TIME**

September is the time of year when we get back to normal routine after the summer break. It's an opportunity to ask how God wants us to make the most of the time He gives us. Although we can't always choose how we use our time, we can control our attitude towards it. How can we use our time wisely?

**Firstly**, see time is a gift from God. Each day is an opportunity to know God better and serve Him. Time isn't inexhaustible, as someday our time on earth will end. 'Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.' (Psalm 90:12). The first thing we can do when we awake is thank God for the gift of another day.

**Secondly**, commit your time to God. Time is not to be wasted, but to be used for God's glory. We are accountable to God for the way that we use our time: 'Be very careful, then, how you live – not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity' (Ephesians 5:15,16). We should ask God to help us organise our time more wisely, to reflect His concerns.

**Thirdly**, set aside time for God, others and ourselves. How often can we go through a whole day without thinking about God or ignoring someone who needs our help? This is because we relegate God to our spare time, so He ends up at the bottom of our list of priorities. Jesus said, 'Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness' (Matthew 6:33). If we prioritise our time for God, people and our needs, the rest of life will fit around them.
