SIMON SAYS

The prodigal son had a request for his Father... gimme my best life now before you die... I know the deal is normally that we get our inheritance when you die, but I'd like it before... Life's too short to sit about being bored, I want to party NOW.

This is a hugely harsh for a son to say to his dad - it's selfish, selfindulgent and insensitive. Which makes it even more incredible that when this party-animal comes home with his tail between his legs that his father does what??.... THROWS HIM A PARTY!!!!

He kills the fattened calf, dresses him up to the nines and gets the music playing.

But this is complicated family, because outside of the party sits the father's other son, and he is feeling pretty grumpy. *"I have never had a party for myself and I refuse to go in to my undeserving brother's bash!"*

I love the Dad's response, *drink it in:* "*My son, you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.*"

I love that - **we had to celebrate, there's been a resurrection!** 1 Peter 1:8 repeats the sentiment -

"Though you have not seen him (Jesus), you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and **glorious joy...**"

In fact, everywhere you look in the New Testament it's there - explicit instruction that the natural response to the Easter event of Jesus' bodily resurrection, and to the miracle of our own conversion (a spiritual resurrection!) is **JOY**! It's even one of the fruit of having the Holy Spirit inside you - check out Galatians 5:22-23.

Some of you enJOY pizza, enJOY football, enJOY a massage, but here's the key question - do you enJOY God?

The Westminster Confession of Faith, says that "Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him for ever." I think this is thoroughly biblical

and incredibly important. The main task of every man and woman who has accepted Christ as Saviour is to glorify God and enjoy Him.

Come along to our evening service where we will be considering the theme "Teach Us to Pray", we believe God is going to show us the truth of Psalm 16:11 which says "you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand." Come and learn how to glorify and enjoy Him.

The prodigal son story is a story about 2 boys, one who learns that the world's parties are shallow and short-living, and another who never learns how to party. But the key character is a Father who loves his children so much that he wants to teach us how to live life to the fullest, who kills the fattened calf, throws a robe around us, a ring on our finger, some shoes on our feet, and want us to realise that to party in His presence is better than anywhere else!!!

No wonder the Psalmist says "I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of the wicked." I'm sure the prodigal son would have said exactly the same thing!

May your joy overcome you sorry, and may you *be filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy*!







THE day after the ascension the world changed.

If the events of the previous 40 days had not been earth shattering enough the coming of the promised helper, the Holy Spirit, 10 days later heralded a whole new way of living for the followers of Jesus Christ.

Even as the disciples stood staring into an empty sky as their Lord was taken in the clouds the challenge of the new age dawning was clear – how to fulfil the great commission without Jesus at the helm?

The answer came in a rush of wind and fire, an awesome display of heavenly power, the first effect of which was to enable all present to speak in other languages.

An age of 'mass communication' was born, the sharing of the Good News made possible in the whole world and for all people and a total reversal of what happened at the Tower of Babel when the nations were formed and men separated lest they get too big for their boots.

Now the people of creation were to unite in Christ alone and for the glory of God through the power of His Spirit. There should have been a sign in the sky proclaiming – **'Danger – God at Work'.**

You see, we the people of God are armed and dangerous; armed with the Gospel of love that saves lives and dangerous to a world that is threatened by this love because people wrongly conclude that it robs them of the pleasures of life and living and of their self-determination. The pleasure the world seeks is fleeting. The joy we Christians receive is eternal. So, we're dangerous and Jesus Christ needs us to be just that and more if the Kingdom is to grow before he returns. Our series in Acts will delve deep into the new way of living demanded of those who follow Jesus Christ in the power of his Spirit. We'll look at how we are supposed to relate to each other and to others.

The myths of the early church, which for many 21st century Christians continue to hold a romanticism and idealism not born out by the facts at the time or able to be transposed to today's world, will be quashed. The book of Acts tells us in modern parlance that it's time to get real about church.


The infant church squabbled, followers fought, they gossiped, they made poor decisions and they got so much wrong BUT their hearts were Spiritually motivated and ultimately lead and they were trying to do the right thing under God. Can we say the same of the church today?

Do we truly believe that the church can make a difference and change the course of history? Are we nothing but spiritual voyeurs and consumers in a 21st Century world which doesn't recognise the hope residing in its midst OR are we **ACT**ivist**S** seeking out the lost and telling them the Good News of Jesus Christ, crucified, resurrected and ascended? The book of Acts says it's time to stand up and stand out!

The early church stood strong in the face of opposition, undeterred by what 'man' could do to them and contemptuous of the praise of human beings. Again, can we say the same of the church today?

They had no mandate to be relevant or 'progressive', entertaining or politically savvy. The mission and priority were simple. Take the Gospel to everyone. Can we say the same of the church today? If the answer is no then what are we going to do about it? What sort of church do you want to be a part of and serve? What's the plan for changing our community?

We're armed and dangerous. It's time to discover a new way of living. It's time to act and to do so fearlessly in the power of the Spirit. The time is **NOW**, 'for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard' Acts 4:20.




TEACH US TO PRAY


The Bishop's theme for the service will be "Wherever You Go" based on Joshua 1:9. Join us for what will be a wonderful service and for some goodies in the hall after.

A CONCERT TO CELEBRATE THE LIFE OF ST. PATRICK

It seems a long time ago now since Friday 16th March 2018 when the above concert took place.

The event was a joint venture between the local Magheralin Community Association and The Parish Church. As co-producer, modesty forbids that I should proclaim the evening a great success, however others, of more impartial standing, assure me that it was.

In addition to the community singing, where the audience entertained themselves, we had a great variety of acts, including instrumental music, dancing, poetry and of course singing. It was a great tribute to the Magheralin community that the entire "cast" was comprised of local talent.

I take this opportunity to thank those whom I "recruited" for agreeing to take part and then working so hard to make the evening a success.

It gave me particular pleasure to be part of the community choir, which, in addition to leading the singing, gave renditions of "Christ be Beside me" to the Malcolm Archer arrangement and "The 23rd Psalm" to the melody of "The Rowan Tree". These pieces were accompanied by Chris Green on piano and Paul Gardiner on bass guitar, with the choir being trained and conducted by Gareth Murray.

Although this was not an evening for financial gain, I am pleased to inform you that, out of the proceeds, we were able to donate over ± 300 to The Association of Guide Dogs for the Blind"

The evening was primarily about celebrating Patrick and this we did through worship elements and by means of a fictional sketch focussed on his ministry.

I am not an authority on St Patrick but his place in history in general and the history of the spread of Christianity in particular fascinates me.

The man who termed himself "*a sinner, a most simple countryman, the least of all the faithful and most contemptible to many*" would never have dreamt that he would, rightly, be credited for being the chief force in advancing Christianity in Ireland.

As a self proclaimed "*fool, from the midst of those who appear wise*" he would never have imagined himself as being instrumental in keeping the light of learning lit, whilst the rest of Europe fell into decline at the fall of the Roman Empire.

All the more surprising that this should take place in the land the Romans called Hibernia – The land of eternal winter!

There is, of course, a lot of misinformation and ill informed comment about Patrick, but it is worth finding out about the real man through reading his confession, which can easily be assessed via the internet.

I believe you will discover a great man of God, worthy not only of celebration but someone from whom we can learn a great deal, even now, almost 1600 years after his death.



The children made Biscuit Bibles to help remind them that we can read all about the Easter Story and Jesus' love for us in the Bible.

What a joy it is to be able to share the Good News of Jesus and to encourage even our youngest to learn more about Him and His love.

The time went so quickly and before we knew it was time to go home. We perhaps owe parents an apology as we are quite sure that after all the activities, food and juice, many of our little ones were hyper well into the evening ... but we were delighted to see so many smiling faces and even the reluctance of some to leave.
